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Here is what Chiara Lubich says about this \mathbf{W} ord of Life from the Gospel:

«With these words, Jesus does not tell the person who is sad to accept their pain and hope for a reward in the future. He also wants them to be happy in the present.

In fact, his kingdom is already here on earth, even though it's different from how it will be in heaven.

The kingdom is present in **Jesus** who **overcame death** by rising from the dead, after having suffered terribly.

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«He is present in us and in the heart of every Christian.
GOD IS IN US. THE TRINITY –
FATHER, SON AND HOLY SPIRIT –
HAVE MADE THEIR HOME IN US.

Therefore, we can experience, here and now, the beatitude that Jesus said we would have.

We might still suffer but we will have new strength that helps us overcome the trials of life. We can help others to carry their burdens and overcome their sufferings. We can see things as Jesus saw them, welcoming suffering as the way to redeem the world».
