
### The communion of goods today

Reflecting on the complexity and fragmentation to which the lives of many people today are subjected, Chiara Lubich realised that Gospel love must be put into practice so that every aspect of life can be transformed.







# In the early days of the Movement

The communion of goods, chosen and practised in complete freedom, is one of the characteristics of the Focolare communities, based on the way the first Christian communities lived.

But how did it begin? Giosi Guella, who was one of the first focolarine with Chiara Lubich from the very beginning of the movement, tells us about some of the events related to this. Later on, Chiara entrusted her with the aspect of the communion of goods and work, known as the 'Red', in the whole Movement.





# Opening the hands of God

In July 2002, Chiara Lubich wrote that our giving opens the hands of God who, in his Providence, steps in, in a practical way and enables us to meet the needs of others. Her words were a commentary on the Gospel phrase "To the one who has will be given and will be in abundance, and from the one who does not have will be taken away even what he has" (Mt 13:12)".

This 'giving' can be experienced starting from the smallest choices of everyday life, and then discovering, as these testimonies from Angola, Vietnam and Italy illustrate, that nothing is small, precisely because it is filled with love, and so it can open God's hands and bear unexpected fruit.

#### The Economy of Communion

**Anouk Grevin** and **Isaías Hernando**, coordinators of the Economy of Communion (EoC) have written to us: "In the 30 years of its existence, the EoC has certainly contributed to building a more just, humane, inclusive and sustainable economy. Today we face enormous challenges globally, including inequality, environmental crises, and unsustainable lifestyles.

The category of communion is still too absent from life and from economic thought. The Economy of Communion wants to focus on people living in situations of poverty, on the vision of business as a common good, where the wealth that is created is shared, and the development of economic paradigms that are alternative to the dominant vision of today. EoC wants to establish processes of change in dialogue with others. All of this arises from charismatic roots that are fully relevant in generating new responses to today's challenges".



The VEO Steering Committee gave a three-year mandate to this team to work on simplifying the structure of the International Centre and the various services that are part of it, so as to slim it down and make it more effective in the light of the changing needs of the Movement and of society today. When we refer to the International Centre, we mean many different entities: the Centre of the Movement and the General Council; the centres of the branches, the dialogue secretariats, the activities and services linked to the aspects.

In drawing up this plan, the ASC group is involving a wide range of people. After a preliminary collection of data on all the entities that make up the Centre, they held an initial series of workshops in February 2023 with representatives of the various "offices" involved, namely the services linked to the various aspects, the secretariats of the dialogues, the centres of the New Generations, and the New Humanity NGO.









In mid-March, a questionnaire was sent out to all employees of the International Centre and to a wide representation of people in the zones. A total of 1,100 replies were received, 270 of which were from groups; the estimate is that about 2,700 people took part in completing the questionnaire.

In April, the committee worked on analysing the results of the questionnaire and of the first workshops.

Characteristic of all the stages of the Commission's work has been listening to each other, respecting the different opinions and viewpoints that have emerged, paying attention to what the questionnaires have put into light, making an effort not to be biased but to understand everyone's reasoning,

discovering that within each statement there is a legitimate need that can be accommodated.



In a few weeks there will be a second series of workshops and then a document will be drawn up containing suggestions for a first draft of a new organisational structure. This document will be presented to the Presidency and the collegial bodies of the Movement (Centre of the Movement and the General Council), and they will begin their own phase of discernment.
