## FOCOLARE CELEBRATES LONG-STANDING AMERICAN PRESENCE

## Lay Ecclesial Movement marks celebratory milestone in North America with enriching programs open to the public.

"That all may be one" (Jn. 17,21) "We were born for these words, for unity, to give a contribution to its realization in the world." *Focolare founder, Chiara Lubich.* 

Many of the lay movements active in the Catholic Church today came to life as early as the 1940s. **Among the first, was the Focolare** - born in the Northern Italian air raid shelters in the town of Trent during the bombings of WWII. **The young founder, Chiara Lubich**, and her friends read the Gospel by candlelight and set out to live its radical message through their love for one another and for the people of the war torn community surrounding them. As they found a new and richer relationship with God through their deepened unity, the foundation for the first communitarian-based spirituality in the Church was laid.

Underscoring the spirituality's role in bringing Jesus' presence into the world through the love generated among them, Pope John XXIII approved the group as an ecclesial lay movement in 1962 under its official name, The Work of Mary. From its humble beginnings in Italy, the Focolare and its message of unity has now reached the farthest corners of the globe – present in 180 countries. Today people of all ages and backgrounds are part of this global family that includes numerous multi-cultural and interreligious communities, members of PROFESSIONAL and academic organizations, and networks of economists, politicians and artists working in solidarity and through enriching dialogue to realize the Movement's goal of universal brotherhood.

## Giving special significance to the 50th anniversary celebration this spring, Focolare President, Maria Voce and Co-president, Giancarlo Faletti, will participate in the following events:
