Margaret Karram: Make every crisis an opportunity

When she met last December with the collaborators of the International Center, the President, Margaret Karram, focused on the main reasons for a major work of economic and organizational review which began a few months ago. She referred to what Pope Francis had said to the participants in the Assembly, in February 2021, when he stressed that we must live this crisis as an opportunity for growth. She said, "We believe that this is a time in which the Holy Spirit is acting. This is my experience in the first two years of my presidency: to believe that the Holy Spirit is prompting us to be more up to date without getting discouraged in the face of human complexity and its contradictions. This is our mandate."

A bit of history: a key word - discernment

An in-depth analysis of the global economy of the Movement began in September 2021. The continuous trend of the economic deficit showed no signs of reversing in the near future. It therefore required immediate action. Even in economic narrowness God wants to tell us something: it is a call for us to cooperate to take concrete steps and make the Charism alive today and be ready and able to respond to the call and to the needs of the world today and in the future.

A working group called “VEO”, *Visione Economica dell’Opera* (Economic Vision of the Movement - EVM) has been established which has identified seven areas of work: four concerning various aspects related to communion of goods, providence, projects and fundraising; three concerning areas for reorganizing, including at the International Center, the little towns and some of the numerous “works” and social activities of the Movement.

Updating of the charism and the Economic Vision of the Movement (EVM)

The objective of the “EVM” working group is **to contribute to the integral sustainability of the Movement**: charismatic, human, ecological and economic. The economic one, in fact, is only one step, albeit a fundamental one, on the path that the Focolare are following to ensure we can reach all the goals of the Movement, and thus give our contribution as a response to the "cry of humanity, of the new generations and of creation".¹

This requires not only a cultural action, but in many cases also structural and organizational change. Therefore: **sustainability, reorganization, subsidiarity**, are the main commitments on which we are working in a network between the Center and the Zones.

The steps to be taken in this phase

Let's start by focusing on the International Center.

The challenge before us now is to **redefine the structure of the International Center** taking into account the "epochal change" to say it with the words of Pope Francis and the need to achieve integral sustainability, ensuring that it is increasingly at the service of the Movement in the different geographical areas of the world.

Since January, an analysis and review of the services and some of the branches and wide-ranging movements has begun in a work of great involvement. The aim of this work is to achieve the full sustainability of the Centre and a review of its service to the Focolare communities in the world today, taking into account the purpose for which it was founded.

In fact, the "vocation" of the International Centre is to express the unity and universality of the Movement, to safeguard and always make accessible the heritage of the charism; to support, develop and accompany realities and initiatives of a general nature.

In the zones a review of the distribution of focolares has been continuing for several years, evaluating the priorities in the different geographical areas also as a result of the reduced number of men and women focolarini who live in the focolare. Instead, at the International Center, this work is at the beginning. The General Assembly of 2014 had already recognised the need to streamline the organization of the Center, providing for forms of decentralization and remote collaboration as we were already aware of the impossibility of supporting its current costs.
